We don't know the end result of catastrophic events, but Jesus does. You can read the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead in John 11:1–44.

Q: What was wrong with Lazarus?

A: He was sick.

Q: What happened when Jesus called out an order to Lazarus in the grave?

A: Lazarus came out!

#### Together Time

Death is never a comfortable topic of discussion. However, Jesus gave us a promise that if we believe in Him, we can live again after we die! The story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead begins sad but ends with rejoicing.
